## DETAILS

### **COST: \$349 PER PERSON**

\*RVCC Students will have the opportunity to participate in several fundraising events. After fundraising, we will let families know how much is left to pay per student and we will ask families to pay what they can towards their child's camp cost. Scholarships will also be available. Lack of funds SHOULD NOT be a reason for your child to not attend camp!!!

### **REGISTRATION DUE: APRIL 12<sup>th</sup>**

We have 21 student spots reserved for camp. If all 21 spots get filled, we cannot guarantee our ability to reserve extra spots. That means that the sooner your child returns the registration form, the sooner they get their spot reserved!

**AGES:** Camp is open to students who have completed 6<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> grades in Spring of 2021.

### **MANDATORY PARENT/STUDENT MEETING:**

Any student planning to attend camp **MUST** attend a mandatory meeting WITH a parent or guardian on one of the following dates:

Saturday, March 20 at 4:00pm  
Sunday, March 21 at 12:00pm

## BEHAVIOR

RVCC is not required to take any students to camp. Students must have a positive behavior track record at all RVCC Youth Group events in order to attend youth camp. Students who repeatedly have behavior & attitude issues at regular youth group events OR on the church van/bus will not be permitted to attend camp out of state, regardless of whether or not they have already reserved their spot. Pastor Mick will be in communication with parents of students who are at risk of losing the privilege of attending youth camp. The behaviors listed to the right will get a student removed from the camp list and/or sent home from camp at their family's expense.

- Use of or bringing to camp: illegal substances, cigarettes, alcohol, pornography, weapons, fireworks, explosives, etc. INCLUDING vaping
- Sexual misconduct, harassment, and abuse
- Fighting (including food fights)
- Profanity or abusive, inconsiderate language
- Excessive noise, including on the bus to/from church and camp
- Use of candles, matches, water balloons, shaving cream, etc. for pranks
- Bullying
- Irresponsible social media use
- Disrespect towards leaders, bus drivers, or other students
- Unwillingness to participate in activities
- Frequent poor attitude
- Inability to follow directions or listen during teaching times


## COVID

Masks must be worn by all students and leaders at all times except when eating.

Church leaders will monitor students for symptoms of illness and will immediately isolate any students displaying symptoms and consult with camp medical staff about sick students returning home. All parents must sign a COVID WAIVER before camp. No refunds will be given.

## LEADER POLICIES

All leaders attending camp with all churches must be over the age of 21, background checked by RVCC and the AZSBC, as well as complete Child Abuse Awareness training provided by Glorieta Camp. It is the goal for leaders to NOT be placed in sleeping rooms with students. Leaders should never be behind a closed door alone with a student.



# WHAT TO PACK

-All required forms (will be turned in before departure)

-Masks for 5 days – we recommend 12-15 masks per student

-Sleeping bag and pillow

-Toiletries (shampoo, soap, toothbrush, feminine products, sunscreen, etc.)

-Closed-toed shoes for activities

- Bible, notebook, pens/pencils

-Swimsuit (with a t-shirt cover-up)

-Towels, washcloth, etc.

-Clothes for 5 days (pack extras, there will be activities, classes, games, sports, etc. and students may want to change clothes)


-Towels, washcloth, etc.

-Optional spending money for snacks and souvenirs

## DRESS CODE:

No undergarments showing, shorts/skirts must be fingertip length or longer, no midriff or cleavage showing, no tube tops or spaghetti straps, tanks must have straps 2" or wider, t-shirts must be worn over swim suits, no bare feet, no inappropriate words or symbols on clothes

## CELL PHONE POLICY



We understand that students and their families may want to communicate during camp. We also know that phones can be used inappropriately and are behavior risks. RVCC has decided that our youth group will NOT be using phones during camp. Students' personal cell phones will be kept with their adult leaders at all times except for a

30-minute phone break once a day. Students can communicate with their families during that 30 minutes. Plan ahead to send a camera with your student if they want to take pictures/videos during the week. In the event of an emergency, parents will be provided with cell numbers for all adult chaperones and students will have walkie-talkies in their rooms overnight.

Any items holding significant value should be left at home! Glorieta Camp is an unlocked campus. Zona Camp is not liable for any stolen or lost items and will not be involved in the investigation or discipline surrounding stolen or lost items. Please make wise decisions with your student when deciding which valuable items they should/should not bring and discuss with them the importance of responsibility in keeping track of their belongings.

## PARENT COMMUNICATION & RESPONSIBILITY



In years past, RVCC has attended camp just 15 minutes away. This year we will be hours away in a completely different state. For this reason, it is of EXTREME importance that parents be reachable quickly in the event of an emergency and/or behavior issue. Please make every attempt to respond to text messages or answer phone calls from Pastor Mick during camp. Before your student leaves for camp, remember to review behavior expectations with them, keeping in mind that you will be responsible for costs incurred with bringing your child home if they should be forced to leave camp early for behavior issues.
